# Supplemental Education Services

- SES is part of the Title 1 program under the No Child Left Behind Act.
- SES began in 2002 and has continued to grow and receive additional government funding each year.
- SES services are only provided to students in a Title 1 failing school who are receiving free or reduced lunch.
- SES is free to students and their parents.

# What do SES tutors do?

- As an SES tutor you are required to meet with the student and conduct tutoring sessions based on a Student Learning Plan and the student's set goals.
- SES tutors receive state approved curriculum from the provider and additional support as needed to help the student achieve his or her goals.
- SES tutors must keep regular attendance records (signed by the parent at each session) and provide student progress reports to the provider.

# When does SES tutoring start and how long does it last?

- SES tutors begin services between mid-Sept and mid-Oct by law.
- Students can and will begin anytime after the initial onset of the program.
- All **Advanced Learners SES tutors** will tutor each of their students for 20hrs. A typical program consists of 2 or 3 1-hr sessions a week until the 20hrs have been met.

# Where and when does the tutoring take place?

**Advanced Learners** provides either in-home or off-site (daycare, library, church, etc) tutoring based on the parent's preference. We do not provide on-site after-school tutoring.

**Advanced Learners** creates a schedule to meet the needs of the family...evenings, weekends, or after school.

**We are different.** Most providers offer services on-site after school in small and large groups. Schedules are pre-set by the provider and are not flexible. We allow tutors and parents to work out a schedule that works for the child.

# Which curriculum and materials are provided?

**Advanced Learners** offers 3 programs:

- Sing, Spell, Read and Write - a full phonics and reading program for students K-2 with games, music, readers and assessments.
- Achiever's Math Club - hands-on learning tools and math practice for students K-2.
- Aim Higher! FCAT - Practice for each Benchmark the student will need to know for the grade appropriate test. There are separate programs for math, reading, and science for students grades 3-12.
- Pre- and Post-Assessment Tests will be conducted to determine the student's weaknesses and document the progress he or she makes during the program.

# How much will an Advanced Learners SES tutor make?

- Tutors can expect to make \$20-\$30/hr. depending on the school district, the tutor's credentials/degrees, experience, and certifications.
- Tutors may begin with up to 3 students and if successful at scheduling all 3 at once, may incrementally add more students.
- Tutors receive 20hrs per student assignment. This will equate to \$400-\$600 per student.
- Tutors who conduct assessment tests will receive a flat rate per test of \$30-\$35 depending on the school district.

# What are the minimum requirements for a tutor to get started as an **Advanced Learners** SES tutor?

1. Become an Advanced Learners tutor by completing our online application.
2. Complete the state required fingerprinting and background screening (detailed directions will be provided by our staff).
3. Submit completed Advanced Learners paperwork and School District required documents.
4. Complete online training tutorial and attend all monthly online webinar trainings.
